# Dave Gottsleben



**Head Men's Coach | 28th Season**

The dean of the South Dakota coaching staff, Dave Gottsleben is entering his 28th season as the Coyote head men's track and field coach in 2011-12.

After establishing the Coyotes as one of the top programs in the North Central Conference, Gottsleben continued that success when USD joined NCAA Division I and the Great West Conference. He has guided the men's squad to three straight indoor titles while earning GWC Coach of the Year three times. The Coyotes also finished second all three years at the outdoor conference meet.

The Coyotes also qualified two individuals - Tane Owens and Matt Kerswill -- for the NCAA West Preliminaries in 2011 as well.

Gottsleben was named the NCC Men's Indoor Coach of the Year (tri-NCC Coach of the Year) in 2007 after directing the Coyotes to its seventh indoor title. Overall, he led USD to 14 men's NCC titles.

Named the U.S. Track and Field/Cross Country Coaches Association National Outdoor Coach of the Year in May 2006, he was selected from eighth regional finalists. It was the second national coach of the year honor for Gottsleben, who was named in 1997 as the USTFCCA National Indoor Coach of the Year.

At USD he has coached student-athletes that have earned 150 All-American honors, as well as six national champions. At the 2006 Outdoor Nationals, he had five All-Americans, including four that finished first or second. He led his squads to eight top-10 finishes, including third at the NCAA Division II finish at the 1997 indoor meet, a fourth-place finish at the 2006 Outdoor and the 2001 Indoor Nationals and third-place result at the 2000 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

He received 11 North Central Conference Coach of the Year honors (combined indoor and outdoor honors). He was also selected the North Central Region Coach of the Year for the sixth time in 2006. In 1994, he received the NCAA Division II Men's and Women's Track and Field Coaches Association Award for his distinguished service to Division II track.

With the leadership of Gottsleben, the Coyotes have enjoyed a rich tradition, placing fourth or better in 36 of the last 41 NCC indoor and outdoor meets. USD won 14 NCC titles under Gottsleben's direction, including seven indoor and seven outdoor titles.

In 1992, 1994, 1997, 1998, 2000, and 2002, he was named NCAA Division II Central Region Coach of the Year.

In 1997, he was named the Division II Men's National Coach of the Year by the U.S. Track Coaches Association. In 1994, Gottsleben received the NCAA Division II Men's and Women's Track and Field Coaches Association Award for his distinguished service to Division II track. He currently serves on the USTFCCA Hall of Fame Committee.

Gottsleben received his undergraduate (1975) and master's degree (1980) from South Dakota State. He was the head coach at Menno (SD) High School from 1975-1979, and the head men's and women's track coach at Dakota State from 1979-1983.

He has a wife, Helen, and a daughter, Kendra.



# Lucky Huber

Lucky Huber is in his 18th year as the women's track and field coach at South Dakota during 2011-12. He has directed the Coyotes to 16 conference championships (10 indoor, six outdoor).

Huber helped build a South Dakota program that excelled at the NCAA Division II and North Central Conference level, and continued that success when the Coyotes became Division I and Great West Conference members during the 2008-09 season. He has since guided the women's program to three straight indoor conference titles and second-place finishes at the outdoor meet. Huber was named the 2009, 2010 and 2011 GWC Indoor Coach of the Year.

The Coyotes also qualified their first individual for the NCAA National Championships in 2010-11 when Bethany Buell reached that level in the pole vault. South Dakota qualified five female individuals in all for the NCAA West Preliminaries during its first year of eligibility.

In spring 2008, Huber was named the U.S. Track and Field/Cross Country Coaches National Women's Outdoor Coach of the Year. It was the second time in his career that Huber received national coach of the year honors as he was also recognized in 2004. Huber was also the USTFCCA's North Central Region Women's Outdoor Coach of the Year four times between 2003 and 2008.

Huber directed the USD women's track and field team to its fifth straight NCC Outdoor Championship in 2008. His team set an NCC record by totaling 255 points. The NCC title was Huber's 13th (seven indoor, six outdoor) of his career.

In his 18th overall season, he was named both the women's indoor and outdoor NCC Coach of the Year in 1997, 1998, 1999, 2005 and 2007. He was the NCC Women's Outdoor Coach of the Year in 2005. He also was selected the North Central Region Coach of the Year in 1997 and 1998, 2006 and 2007.

In 1998, Huber directed the Coyotes to second-place team finish at the NCAA Indoor Nationals, which is the highest finish by a USD indoor or outdoor squad in track and field history.

Huber, who worked with the USD Academic Advising Center for 17 years, received both his Bachelor of Science degree in elementary education (1990) and Master of Arts degree in education (1992) from USD. A native of Elk Point, S.D., Huber lettered three years for the Coyote track and field team, while competing in the pole vault and decathlon (1986-90).

Since becoming the Head Women's coach at USD in 1994, he has coached 187 track and field All-Americans. In addition, he has coached 10 national champions (Nancy Overman, discus; Elena Swan, long jump, triple jump; Sarah Deckert, 400-meter run; and Sandy Pelkofer, pole vault; Brianna Edwards, heptathlon; Emma Erickson, 800 meter run (indoors and outdoors); along with Sam Pribyl, (men's pole vault) and Steve Gordon (men's triple jump) and two time Olympic polevaulter Derek Miles. He has worked extensively over the years with USD's jumpers, including Miles, who is a two-time Olympian. Miles won the 2008 Olympic Trials and took fourth in the 2008 Beijing Olympics. He also was the 2008 IAAF World Athletics Champion.

Huber is married to the former Stacy Kracht of Mitchell, S.D. They have two daughters, Mackenzie and Josie. Kracht is a member of the Coyotes Sports Hall of Fame and formerly a four-year starter on the USD women's basketball team.



# Dan Fitzsimmons

Dan Fitzsimmons is in his fourth season as the South Dakota head cross country coach and distance coach for track and field.

Under the guidance of Fitzsimmons, the Coyotes have recorded two runner-up team finishes (women's team in 2008 and 2009), one individual champion (Ramsey Fitzsimmons in 2008), one conference runner-up (Kelsey Maloney in 2008), one conference freshman of the year (Jeff Mettler in 2010). The Coyotes have had 12 all-conference team selections, including four first-team selections, since Fitzsimmons took over in 2008. In their first year in the Summit League in 2011, the Coyote cross country teams each finished fifth. Mettler was first-team all-conference.

A South Dakota alum, Fitzsimmons was named head coach in July 2008. He has also been instrumental in the development of the Coyotes' distance runner corps in track and field, which have played a key role in helping South Dakota's men's and women's earn three straight Great West Conference Indoor Championships. South Dakota has recorded eight individual conference championships in the distance events, including five from Ramsey Fitzsimmons, along with five individual runner-up finishes. The Coyotes have had three GWC Most Valuable Performers, including Ramsey Fitzsimmons (2008 and 2009) and Rob Gregoire (2010).

In outdoor track and field, the Coyotes have also recorded five individual championships in the distance events along with three runner-up finishes.

Prior to coming to South Dakota, Fitzsimmons built the Yankton cross country and track and field programs into state and regional powers.

During his four-year career at South Dakota, Fitzsimmons set the USD record in the 3,000m steeplechase which stood from 1985-00. He graduated from USD in 1986 with a bachelor's degree in physical education and earned a master's degree in exercise science in 1999. His wife, Cecilia, was a seven-time NCC track and field champion and former record holder in the long and triple jump. She was inducted into the USD Hall of Fame in 2000. Fitzsimmons and his wife, Cecilia, are the parents of Sean, Shannon, Connor and Brenna.

# Derek Miles

Former Coyote Derek Miles is in his 10th season as an assistant coach at the University of South Dakota during 2011-12. He works primarily with the pole vault and jumps.

A two-time Olympian, Miles finished fourth in the pole vault at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, after competing in 2004 in Athens, Greece. He won the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials and was the IAAF 2008 World Athletics Champion. He has also placed highly in international meets during his career.

In 2008, he won the pole vault competition at the Drake Relays (18'04), Reno Vault Summit (19'0.25), and Derek Miles Pole Vault Summit (18'05). He organized the Miles Pole Vault Summit which brought 10 of the top vaulters in the world, including four U.S. Olympians, to Vermillion.

He was inducted into the Henry Heider Memorial Coyote Sports Hall of Fame in fall 2006. Miles earned a bachelor's degree in history in 1996 and a master's degree in athletic administration in 1998 from USD.

A Division II All-American in the pole vault, Miles remains one of the top vaulters in the world. He had one of the best jumps in the world (19'0.25) during the 2008 season. He finished seventh at the Athens Olympics in 2004, and was ranked fifth in the world at the end of the 2005 season. He has been ranked as one of the top three vaulters in the U.S. by Track and Field News for the last five years.

Miles owns a personal best of 19-2.50 that he set at the DakotaDome in 2005, which was the seventh-best vault in the world that year. In 2003, he was the USA Indoor champion and was fifth at the World Outdoor competition.

He and his wife, Tori (Devericks), live in Tea, S.D. Tori is also a USD graduate.

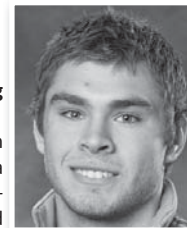

# Season Recap: Coyote Track and Field Adds Another Chapter in 2010-11

The South Dakota track and field programs are rich with success in their past – 18 national championships, dozens of conference team championships and more than 420 All-American honors.

The 2010-11 season added another historic chapter to the accomplishments of the Coyote programs. South Dakota, eligible for the NCAA Division I Outdoor Track and Field Championships for the first time since making the move to Division I, saw its first individual reach an NCAA National Championship – redshirt freshman Bethany Buell – after qualifying seven individuals for the NCAA West Preliminaries in May. The Coyote teams successfully three-peated as Great West Conference Indoor Champions in February, and by the time the season was complete, had 86 all-conference honorees and 10 Great West Conference Athletes of the Week.

## At the Starting Line

South Dakota's indoor season began with the annual intrasquad meet on Dec. 9. Freshman Travis Brenner (Yankton, S.D.) won two events, the one-mile and 800 meters, while for the women, sophomore Gabriel Williams (Sioux City, Iowa), sophomore Carol Miller (Meade, Neb.) and senior Erica Krull (North Butler, Iowa) also each won two events.

The Graphic Edge Alumni Meet followed for the Coyotes in January, as the women won six individual events and the men won four. Gabriel Williams and sophomore Alexa Duling (Gregory, S.D.) each set personal-bests in the 60 meters and 60-meter hurdles, respectively, to pace the women, while sophomore Matt Kerswill (Schofield, Wis.) and senior Bill Lane (Sioux City, Iowa) led the men with wins in the 60 meters and 400 meters, respectively.

## Road-Tested

After the two home meets to kick off the indoor campaign, the Coyotes then hit the road, competing against high-caliber competition at indoor meets at Minnesota, Iowa State and Nebraska.

At the Jack Johnson Classic at Minnesota on Jan. 22-23, the Coyotes competed against several prominent Division I programs, including Minnesota, Iowa and South Florida. Junior Cody Linder (Plattsmouth, Neb.) finished fifth in the men's triple jump at 44-10 3/4, which was the best in the Great West up to that point, while junior Kenna Wolter (Santa Maria, Calif.) was third in the women's triple jump at 38-2, which was also best in the GWC up to that point.

The Coyotes continued their road competition at Iowa State's Bill Bergan Classic on Jan. 29, as the women placed fourth and the men were sixth. Gabriel Williams won the 60 meters and 200 meters to pace the Coyote women. She ran a personal-best time of 7.56 in the 60 meters.

At the Frank Sevigne meet in Nebraska on Feb. 4 and 5, Buell (St. Louis, Mo.) set a new school indoor record in the women's pole vault with an effort of 13-4 1/4. Brenner led the Coyote men, claiming the victory in the mile at 4:18.

A week later, Buell set another school record in the pole vault after clearing 13-7 1/4 at the Iowa State Classic, which was the 12th highest in NCAA Division I at that point in the season.

## Big Wins in the Big Apple

The South Dakota track and field teams made it a three-peat at the Great West Conference Indoor Championships Monday as both Coyote teams won titles for the third straight year. The Coyote women recorded the victory with a score of 222 points, while the men won with 170.5 points.

South Dakota head coaches Lucky Huber and Dave Gottsleben each earned GWC Coach of the Year honors for the women and men, respectively, for the third consecutive year. Freshman Tansha Clarke (St. Catherine, Jamaica) was named the GWC Women's

Freshman of the Year while Buell received the award for the top women's performance after a record-shattering effort in the pole vault.

The Coyote women's team won eight events overall, including the distance medley relay captured on Sunday, while the Coyote men won three events.

Buell successfully defended her conference pole vault title with a meet record-breaking effort of 4.12 (13-6 1/4). Clarke won the pentathlon with 3,216 points on her way to earning freshman of the year honors. Duling had an outstanding meet, scoring 26 points with two wins and a third-place finish. Duling won the 400-meter dash at 55.36, winning the event by one second, and added a win in the 200 dash at 24.80. She was third in the 60-meter hurdles at 8.93.

Freshman Adam Mikkelsen (Gregory, S.D.), Linder and senior Jeff Sebern (Brookings, S.D.) each won events for the men.

## The Great Outdoors

South Dakota's outdoor season started March 19 in Tempe, Ariz., at the Baldy Castillo Invite, as Buell set a school outdoor record in the pole vault at 13-2 1/4. Duling just missed a school record in the 400-meter hurdles at 1:00.58.

Junior Emma Erickson (Gayville, S.D.) shined at the Stanford Invitational on March 26, winning her section of the 800 meters at 2:07.45 – just .49 seconds away from her school record.

The Coyotes returned closer to home for the Vance Butler Invitational in Sioux Falls, S.D., on April 2, winning eight events. Junior Ashlea Johnson (Yankton, S.D.) and Williams each won individual events while also being part of the winning 4 x 100 relay team. Senior Tane Owens (Pierre, S.D.) captured the men's pole vault at 15-9 to pace the Coyotes.

South Dakota hosted its lone outdoor meet in Yankton on April 9 and swept rivals South Dakota State and North Dakota at the meet. Duling won two hurdle events, while Linder added wins in the long jump and triple jump.

The Coyotes sent a contingent to the prestigious Mt. SAC Relays on April 14-16. Buell and Duling continued their outstanding seasons with record-setting performances. Buell set another outdoor record with a 13-3 1/2 in the pole vault, while Duling ran a 1:00.15 to set a record in the 400-meter hurdles. At the Bryan Clay Invitational in Asuza, Calif., on April 16, Wolter won her section of the triple jump at 40-10 1/4, a personal-best, while Clarke won the 200 dash at 26.49.

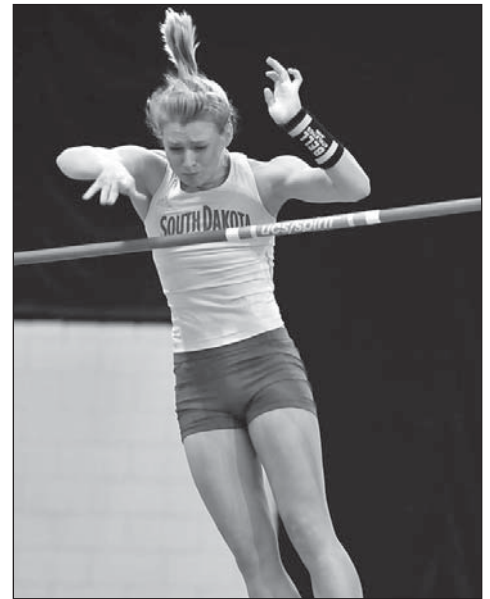
The Coyotes then headed to the Drake Relays, where sophomore Ethan Marquardt (Albert Lea, Minn.) set a personal-best in the 10,000 meters. Freshman Jeff Mettler (Eureka, S.D.) finished seventh in the 3,000-meter steeplechase at 9:10.35.

The Coyotes then competed at the Howard Wood Relays in Sioux Falls on May 6-7 as they prepared for the Great West Outdoor Championships. Buell set a new school pole vault mark again with an effort of 13-9 1/2 – crushing the previous outdoor record by six inches. Duling won the 100-meter hurdles and 200 meters at the event, while Linder won the men's long jump at 22-4.

## Mosley Leads Way at Great West Outdoor

Senior Jasmine Mosley had a dominant all-around performance to highlight a strong three days of competition for the Coyote teams at the Great West Conference Outdoor Championships on May 12-14 in Orem, Utah. Both Coyote teams finished second, as the men lost by just one point while the women placed second at 221 points.

Mosley (Bellevue, Neb.) won three events and received the Most Outstanding Performance Award as a result. She set a new school record in the hammer throw at 180-5 3/4 and also captured wins in the discus and shot put.

For the men, senior Tane Owens (Pierre, S.D.) shattered his previous personal best -- and GWC Outdoor meet record -- to win the pole vault at 16-8 3/4. The Coyote men's 4 x 100 relay, consisting of sophomore Michael Burrus (Papillion, Neb.), sophomore Brandon Kovash (Harrisburg, S.D.), junior Jared Clement (LeMars, Iowa) and Kerswill, set a new record at 40.79, edging the previous record of 40.80 set in 2002. It is the fastest time in the state of South Dakota history.

Also earning wins for the Coyote men were Kerswill (100 meters), Mettler (men's steeplechase) and freshman Cody Snyder (Lake Andes, S.D.), who won the shot put.

For the women, in addition to Mosley's outstanding performance, Erickson added two more conference titles to her resume with victories in the 800 and 1,500 meter events, while Duling and Wolter each won events for the Coyote women. Buell, who redshirted the 2010 outdoor season, won the pole vault.

## Heading West

The South Dakota track and field teams made history in their first year of Division I postseason eligibility with seven qualifiers for the NCAA West Preliminaries, which were held at Hayward Field in Eugene, Ore., on May 26-28.

Five Coyote women competed at the West Preliminaries – Mosley, Erickson, Wolter, Buell and Duling. Kerswill (100 meters) and Owens represented the Coyote men's team at the West Preliminaries.

All seven had solid showings at the event. Buell led the way by placing in a tie for 10th in the pole vault, which qualified her for the NCAA Track and Field Championships. Buell is the first Coyote to advance to the NCAA Division I National Championships.

## Buell Earns All-America Honors to Cap Off Stellar Campaign

Bethany Buell earned All-American status in the pole vault at the NCAA Division I Track and Field Championships on June 10 in Des Moines, Iowa. Buell, the only athlete from the Great West Conference to compete at the nationals, finished 13th in the event to attain the honor.

Buell finished at 13-1 1/2 during the competition to earn Second-Team All-America honors from the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association.

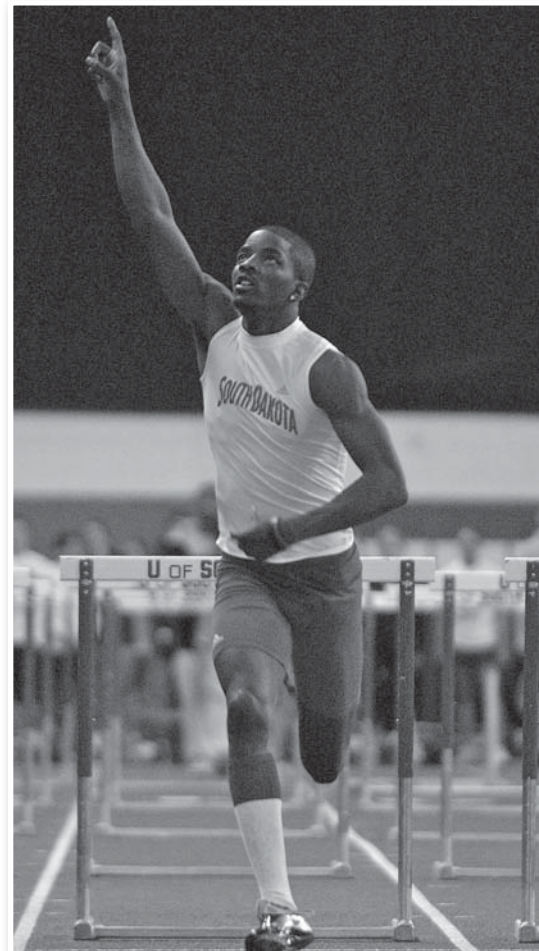

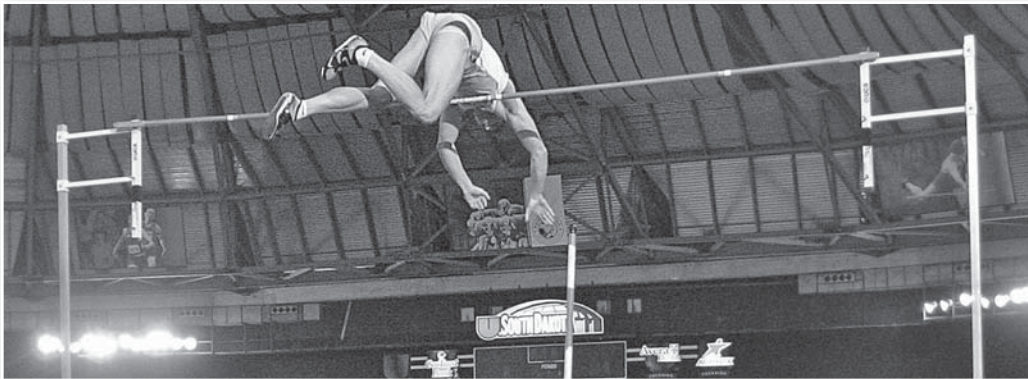

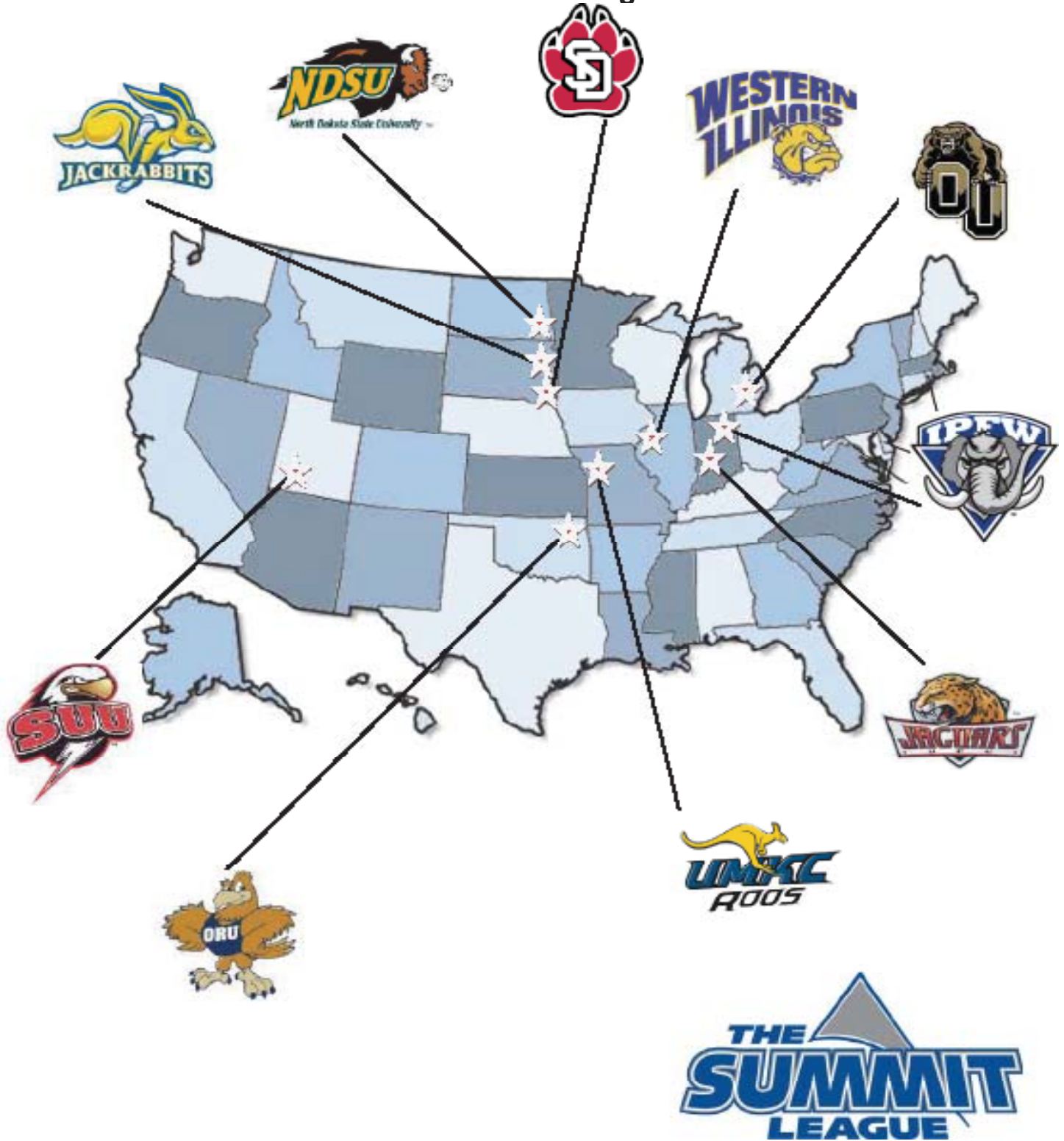
